



Lifeline's Settlement DV-alert* (Domestic Violence Response Training) is a nationally recognised training program designed specifically for Humanitarian Settlement Program Staff supporting refugee communities in Australia to confidently:

- RECOGNISE signs of domestic and family violence (DFV) within the context of migrant and refugee communities
- RESPOND with culturally responsive and appropriate care
- REFER people experiencing or at risk of domestic and family violence to culturally appropriate support services

Emerging international research is increasingly recognising the impact of pre-arrival trauma on women's experiences of family and domestic violence within settlement contexts. This training provides knowledge and skills required to deliver one on one support for refugee and humanitarian entrants where domestic and family violence is identified.
